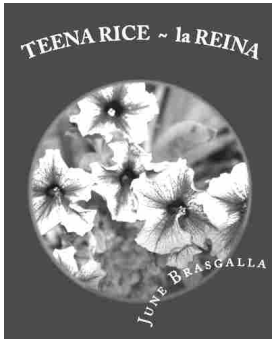

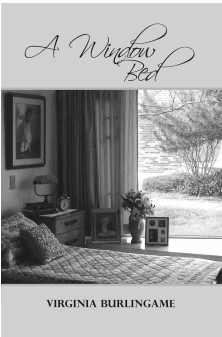

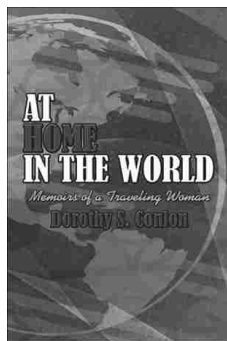


***A Window Bed***

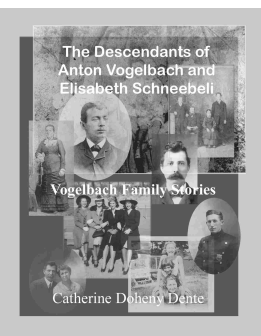

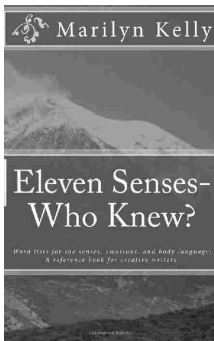

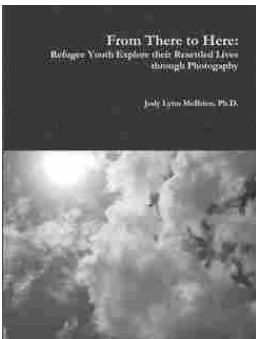


***Eleven Senses- Who Knew? Word lists for the senses, emotions, and body language: A reference book for creative writers***

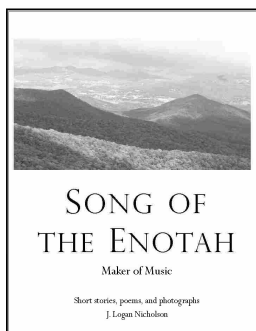

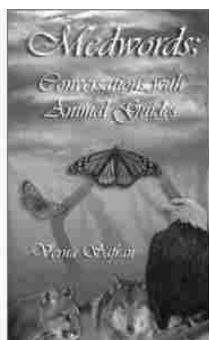

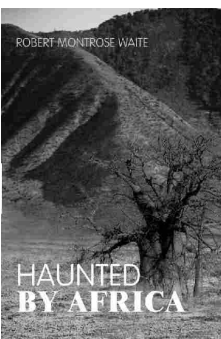
